- 2. In *The House of Seven Gables* how do Clifford's and Judge Pyncheon's views of the value of property compare?
- 3. Does it matter whether there is an actual House of Seven Gables?
- 4. Why does James have trouble finding The House of Seven Gables?
- 5. Show how objects, places and buildings in *The House of Seven Gables* characterize changes seen by Hawthorne's Generation? Compare the role of three pairs of objects: the daguerreotype and the portrait; the scent shop and the kitchen; and the organ grinder versus the fountain. Is Hawthorne deliberately using these objects to comment on change over time?
